

Micro teaching was conducted from 22nd March 2021 to 27thMarch, 2021.

Each pupil-teacher delivered one micro lesson plan per day. The plans were evaluated by teacher educators. The feedback was also provided to the student teachers for improvement in their teaching skills.

Simulated teaching practice is provided with a demonstration lesson plan by a teacher educator. Simulated teaching was conducted from 18th November 2019 to 30th November 2019.

Students were asked to prepare four simulated lesson plans in each teaching methods and deliver them. (online & offline both modes were used).

PRACTICE TEACHING:

After the completion of simulated teaching all pupil teachers are prepared to present lesson in their respective teaching methods. Practice teaching conducts in different schools, but due to COVID-19, this year it was held as simulated teaching in continuation. Each student must deliver a lesson plan in a day which is evaluated by the teacher educator. The feedback is provided to the students. The peers also observe about ten lesson plan of their classmates and give the feedback. Teaching is aided with working models and effective teaching aids. They are guided to prepare various teaching aids so that the lesson can be made interesting for all the students.

Teaching Dates: - From 12th April 2021 to 30th April, 2021 (i.e., 12, 13, 14, 15, 19, 20, 22, 23, 24, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30th April, 2021)

Note: Due to COVID-19 schools were closed and classes were conducted online. Due to this practice teaching could not be conducted in schools. Practice teaching was conducted as simulated teaching offline and online mode both.

An authorized attempt to gain unauthorized access to a computer system, application, or data is referred to as ethical hacking. Duplicating the strategies and actions of malicious attackers is part of carrying out an ethical hack. This practice aids in the detection of security flaws, which can then be addressed before a malicious attacker can exploit them.

The IT fest was started at 10:00am at the college seminar hall with the staff members and all students presented in the guidance of the principal Dr. Nisha Singh with a common goal to learn something valuable. The fest began with lamp lighting session for which Ms Sangeeta welcomed Principal Dr. Nisha Singh and the HODs of all the departments to come on the stage and give a tribute to Maa Saraswati the goddess of Education.

The BCA/BBA/B.COM final year students organized this event under the guidance of Mr. Arvind Kumar Pandey, Head of the Department of Computer Applications. The objective of this event was to provide various ideas on protection of network and reveal skillfulness on ethical hacking.

During this event, Sumit (BCA 5th sem)various issues related to Ethical Hacking were discussed. Ethical Hacking is the official method to hack systems and find loop holes in existing security systems, networks applications. Issues that are raised in this process are used in research and development for developing high security systems. During the development of the Internet, computer security has become a major concern for industry. Companies want to take advantage of the Internet for electronic commerce, advertising, information distribution and access, and other pursuits, but they are also worried about the possibility of being "hacked." Concurrently, the potential customers of these services too are worried about maintaining control of personal information that varies from credit card numbers to social security numbers and home addresses.



Second half session Krishna and Roshan (BCA 5th Sem) highlighted the necessity of a hacking report to be confidential, as its leak can make the organizations face security risks. If this goes wrong in any way, it may prove fatal for the organization or lead to penalties and loss. Ethical hacking is done by hackers on owner's request, primarily, in corporate companies and organizations. Ethical hacking techniques may be used for game cheat codes, hacking accounts and for other good results; but for the most part it is used for fighting against cyber terrorism and to take preventive action on hackers.

In the last, Abhishek Shandaliya and Vishal(BCA 5th Sem) practically done. Ethical Hacking and the students posed many queries which were resolved by him very adroitly. Overall, event was very interactive and informative for students.

How it will be useful to students: -

There is considerable anecdotal evidence that students respond well in subjects involving programming of robots. Programming can be too abstract. By having to control a physical robot and seeing what goes wrong, students learn what robots can and cannot do. They also learned the need for precise instructions. There's no doubt that there will be a need for people to be involved in programming mechanical devices in the foreseeable future. By programming robots, students can discover if they have aptitude and interest in a job market of the future.

Introduction

A one-day workshop on Introduction to Robotics and Arduino coding for the students of 1st level undergraduates was organized on 12th February 2021 under the banner of BCA at Modern College of Professional Studies. This workshop comprises of giving the participating students an idea about Robots, Robotics, Types of Robots and their applications, Career in Robotics, Introduction to Arduino, Introduction to Bluetooth RC Car, live demo of building Bluetooth RC car, test running this car, doubt clarification session, last notes and conclusion.

Details of Workshop

On 12th February 2021, BCA/BCA/B.COM department of MCPS conducted the workshop on "Introduction to Robotics and its applications. First Dr. Sachin Kansal presented a keynote on "Introduction to Robots and Robotics"; "Introduction to Arduino and its IDE "and simple applications of Arduino on LED and its coding. The example comprises of "S.O.S Morse Code" and "Traffic light Signals" using LED.

In the first session students got familiar with the term Robot, how to identify whether a machine is a Robot or an autonomous boot, Robotics, Aspects of Robotics, philosophy of AI (Artificial Intelligence), Brief on Machine Learning and types of Robots. Informative videos from Boston Dynamics were shown to students.

In the next part a brief introduction to Arduino was given to students. They got familiar with various development boards and learnt the development environment for Arduino. Working with Arduino I/O pin was taught and functions of various embedded components were explained. Later simple application of Arduino like blinking LED and its coding was explained.

In the last part of the session, more applications of Robotics were explained and showed. Applications included "S.O.S Morse code" u sing simple LED and Arduino coding; "Traffic Light Signaling" using LED and Arduino coding.

In the meantime students were free to ask any questions regarding the domain if they had any doubt about any topics explained. Students without any hesitation asked questions and after hearing answers from our presenters they were satisfied. Overall student learnt the basics of working with Arduino and gained basic knowledge of various Arduino development boards; Programming environment; onboard features of Arduino Uno.


CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

A guest lecture was organized by the Department of Management in order to create awareness among the students regarding Direct Tax and laws relating to it.




